



Construction Notice

Dear Salt Lake City resident:

We are beginning construction of a new Water Reclamation Facility at the site of the existing facility, which is located at 1365 West 2300 North. This facility will take six years to complete and is one of the largest public works projects in Salt Lake City's history. We are rebuilding the facility to meet mandatory new water quality standards, improve efficiency and reliability, and to avoid risks associated with operation of a 55-year-old facility near the end of its lifespan.

Because the WRF is a critical piece of infrastructure, we're taking a strategic and methodical approach to its construction. The facility treats about 33 million gallons of wastewater every day and is the City's only wastewater treatment facility. It must operate 24/7 without interruption, even during construction. Therefore, the design and construction will be completed in stages.

Initial work includes creating a construction staging area, removing the existing concrete solids drying beds, and bringing in dirt fill and preload material to compact the soil. This will create a stable base for constructing new buildings and waste processing units.

During this first stage of construction, there will be increased truck traffic coming along 2300 North, to and from I-15. Motorist and pedestrian access will be maintained. To minimize the impact construction might have in the area, we are putting in place plans for traffic management and dust control. Our construction work will take place primarily Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., but if needed the contractor (with our approval) may work longer hours and on the weekend. Our contractor will comply with the City's noise ordinances and will take measures to minimize impacts to the surrounding neighborhood.

This project will ensure that the water City residential, business, and industrial discharge to the sewer is treated and safely returned to the environment in a responsible manner. Additionally, discontinued use and demolition of the solids drying beds during this initial stage of construction is one of the first improvements we will make to help reduce odors from the facility.
